



COVID 19 INFECTION CONTROL TRAINING PROGRAM- June 2nd and June 9th 2020



Considering the high risk of transmissibility of n-Corona Virus in dental setting, a training program for dental college auxiliary staff, faculty and PGs' was organized by Department of Public health dentistry.

The training program was conducted in 2 sessions. The first session was exclusively for dental auxillary staff held on June 2nd 2020 and a second session for the Dental faculty and PG's. Dr DhanyaMuralidharan, H.O.D, Dept of Public health dentistry welcomed the gathering and introduced the need for Infection control procedures in dental college in the midst of Corona pandemic.Dr Anupama A, Senior lecturer, Department of Community Medicine, KMCT Medical College took a class on basic infection control procedures in the midst of Corona virus pandemic. Both sessions were conducted in Lecture hall 3 of KMCT Dental College at 10 am on Tuesday- session 1 02/06/2020 & session 2-09/06/2020.

A total of 46 dental college auxillary staff and 23 faculty participated. The sessions lasted for 2 hours each.

The basic infection control guidelines as prescribed by DCI, CDC, WHO and Govt of Kerala were covered. Special focus was made on pre screening triage, disinfection of dental office, prohylaxisto be taken and education regarding hand hygiene, cough etiquette, social distancing, donning and doffing PPE etc were covered.

The talk was followed by a demonstration of Donning and doffing PPE. This was followed by an interactive session between guest faculty and staffs.




WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY: June05/06/2020


Students also organised home visits and food kit distribution at individual level at their neighbourhood abiding the protocol strictly.



Children and adults with impairments and special needs are more vulnerable to health issues, require additional assistance, and rely on others to attain and maintain good health. One of their most critical health demands is a clean mouth, which will be influenced by your capacity to provide the appropriate support. Many parents/caregivers of people with special needs, on the other hand, lack sufficient knowledge or understanding of special care dentistry and homecare regimens for these people, putting them at greater risk of poor oral health outcomes. 

PALLIATIVE CARE INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME AT INSTITUTE OF PALLIATIVE MEDICINE, KOZHIKODE- November 28th2021



A special program for interns 'Palliative Care Internship Program' was initiated by the Deptof Public Health Dentistry, KMCT Dental College. The program was initiated in collaboration with Institute of Palliative Medicine, Kozhikode, a WHO recognized center providing palliative care. The program intended to provide the interns an opportunity to get exposure and training in Community based palliative care. On 28th November 2021 the fresh batch of 75 Interns during their clinical posting in Dept of Public Health Dentistry, were posted for a period of one week at Institute of Palliative Medicine, Kozhikode, on rotation. The program included discussions, O.P and I.P care for patients, Home visits with palliative care team, Volunteer services, News breaking and other interactive sessions designed to help students understand their role in alleviating the difficulties of terminally ill and chronically debilitated persons. A total of 13 students completed their postings at IPM as on 31st December 2021.

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A Dental screening and treatment camp was conducted on 18/12/2021, A Special Oral Health Program was Organised for the tribal population of Karassery Grama Panchayath by the Department of Public health dentistry, KMCT Dental College, Manassery in association with Karassery Grama Panchayath at Thottakad, IHRD College campus as a part of Gothra Sanjeevani Project 2021-22. The dental camp began at 10:00 am and was inaugurated by Smitha VP, Grama Panchayath President. Following the inaugural ceremony an oral health awareness session was conducted for each inmate individually following appropriate social distancing. A total of 14 tribal people were screened for dental health problems by the dental internsand dental faculty using the KMCT Dental College mobile unit. Persons requiring more complex management of dental problems were referred to KMCT Dental College, Manassery. The camp concluded at 1:30 pm. The dental camp was well appreciated by the organizers and camp attendees.


TRAINING PROGRAM FOR POSTGRADUATE STUDENTS FOR MANAGING KIOSK ON 22/12/21

A field visit to MILMA Dairy Plant, Peringalom, was organized for Final year part I and third year students. This visit was organized in order to help the students understand the process of milk purification as a first step in prevention of Milk borne diseases.
